★ **Orange-bellied parrot**
(Neophema chrysogaster)

This is one of the rarest birds in the world. There are fewer than 50 left in the wild.



★ **Blue-eyed black lemur**

(Eulemur flavifrons)

The blue-eyed black lemur population is critically endangered. There are probably fewer than 1,000 left in the wild. Only about 75 live in captivity.



★ **Clouded leopard**

(Neofelis nebulosa)

The clouded leopard population is decreasing. There are less than 10,000 mature individuals in the wild.



★ **South Georgia king penguins**

(Aptenodytes patagonicus patagonicus)

King penguins have been hunted for eggs, blubber, oil, and feathers. Commercial hunting for them is now banned. As a result their population is slowly increasing.
